READING TIPS.

THE SAINTS SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED to experience and enjoy a crucial point day by day and hour after hour during the week. Their assignment for the week would be to study, to learn, and to experience and enjoy this crucial point. When the saints come back to the next meeting a number of them will have the experience of this crucial point. Many times in the past the saints gave testimonies merely of their experiences with seemingly nothing related to the Word. By experiencing, enjoying, and laboring on a crucial point of the truth for an entire week, the saints will give testimonies not merely of their experiences, but of their experiences wrapped up with the divine revelation. Their testimonies will be a mingling of the divine Word with their experiences.

Everybody wants to speak, but no one has anything to speak about. By laboring in a crucial point of the truth, you create something for the saints to speak about. This is why I say again—do not take the easy, short-cut way. We all need to take the way of labor for the long run. If you practice like this week after week, month after month, and year after year, consider what the issue will be in your locality after four years. The issue will be something marvelous.

I assure you that this is the best way not just to use the Bible in the way of knowledge but in the way of life. We can use the notes of the Recovery Version plus the Life-study Messages in order to dive into the crucial points of the Scriptures. The notes of the Recovery Version and the Life-studies are a mine that requires much digging on your part. Going to these two sources will save you much time. If you get into these mines you will see something more and something higher. Take the way of laboring on the crucial points of the truth.

1. Use online resources such as: readhisword.com, ministrybooks.org/reading, excellentbeliever.com, and biblechallenges.com to set up a schedule.

2. Join a reading group for greater accountability.
3. Purchase your own hard copy of the book so that you can highlight, underline, and take notes.
4. Review your highlighted notes weekly and transfer key insights to your personal Bible.
5. Set aside a definite time each day for reading; be regulated in keeping this time. In addition, practice the principle of reading “here a little, there a little” (cf. Isa. 28) whenever time avails.
6. When coming across prayers found in your reading, do not rush through them but exercise to prayerfully make those your own before the Lord.
7. Ministry reading should not replace Bible reading; maintain your normal Bible reading.
8. Continue reading even if you do not understand all that you’ve read; do not be discouraged if you forget most of what you’ve read.
9. If you have lost your appetite, continue reading until your appetite returns.
10. The tortoise wins the race.
